Dakota Software's Toolkit for Adagio is a collection of utilities essential for Adagio users who wish to maintain their data in an orderly fashion.

Amongst the many features of this product are the following worth noting here. The Toolkit performs 'Change To', 'Combine Into' and 'Copy To' functions. When codes are combined, all associated data is also combined, including statistics, posted transactions, outstanding balances, quantity, costs and notes. Also, to ease transition to your new numbers, you can choose to leave the original code in place (cross-referenced), with the name changed to reflect the new code. Then, after a user-defined number of days, the cross-references can be removed. Finally, an audit trail records all changes and can be printed in summary or detail.

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Faster Ledger Entry

Question: When I am entering transactions in Ledger, how can I skip the second line of the description fields? It will speed up data entry by one less tab keystroke, and we never use that field. The older version of Ledger only had one line.

Answer: Under Company Profile | Batch Options, check off the box "Skip 2nd entry description".

Check Reconciliation "E"

Question: I came across an "E" as a status while doing check reconciliation. At first I thought it was similar to the "P" status, however this is not the case as the check is registered. So what does the "E" stand for and what caused it to show up?

Answer: "E" means Cleared with Error. It has the same functional meaning as Cleared but it makes a journal entry to cash for the difference between the check amount and the amount cleared. The other side of the entry goes to the Bank Error account as defined for that bank.

Defective Product Return

Question: When a defective product is returned by a customer and the vendor is not willing to replace or reimburse for it, we have to record this as part of write-off. We issue a Credit Note to the customer for the defective item by unchecking the return box so that the system won't add back the quantity of this returned item, but how about the cost for the write-off? Is there an extra step we need to perform?

Answer: No extra step is required. You will have no sales, and yet the cost will show up in cost of sales and the inventory balance sheet account will be reduced. This makes good sense.

If you feel strongly about the cost not showing up in cost of sales, you can make a journal entry to move it to an inventory write off account.

Search via "Ship-To" Field

Question: Is it possible to search by Ship-to addresses in Order Entry? We have many customers with branches which are often not named the same as the main account. It would be helpful to search by these names when entering a new order.

Answer: When creating a new order in Order Entry, you can use the SmartFinder from within the Ship-to code to search for the customer/ship-to code combination, using the 'Description 1' field (which is the primary Ship Name) as the search basis. When the desired record is found, selecting it will insert both the customer and the ship-to codes.

At the current time, there is no special Ship-to Name field to search like there is for the customer name.

Sales Analysis Address List

Question: I have generated a list of customers in Sales Analysis (v 9.0B) showing a particular item sold and in a specific date range. I am trying to create an address list using these customers to create a mail merge document.

Is it possible using Adagio Receivables, OrderEntry or Inventory to create an address list with the same criteria listed above. We're trying to avoid having to manually create an address list in an Excel document.

Note: We don't have GridView which may or may not be able to perform this function.

Answer: GridView could do this reading of the addresses into the customer list very easily, provided that the filter for selecting the customers by the item sales can be done - and it seems a very easy workspace to setup. In fact a sample GridView workspace is pretty much already set up to do this.

If you don't have GridView, the next best way directly from Adagio is to set up a Filter for the customers in Receivables, apply the filter, and edit the columns on the grid to include the addresses. Then export the grid to Excel. However, only customer fields can be selected for filters, and whether a particular item was sold in a date range is not part of the available criteria.

Or, you could export the entire customer list with Addresses to Excel, and use the VLOOKUP functionality in Excel to read the address from the complete customer list sheet into your sales-filtered customer list. 🎵
